about the BELL CORE Requirements

Linked Course Requirement:

All Music Majors must take two "linked" Human Experience courses during the spring semester of their Freshman year. One of the courses must be MUH 1200 Introduction to Music: History, Style and Culture. (Beginning Spring 2006, ClassFinder will list options for linked courses with MUH1200.) The two linked courses have the same students and are connected by a natural overlap in content, allowing students to encounter a subject using the perspective, methods, and questions of two different disciplines. These are NOT extra courses; rather, each is one of the Human Experience courses required in the BELL core.

Global Studies Requirement:

Students must take four Global Studies courses (12 hours) before graduating. These are NOT extra courses. Rather, they are courses (in either the general education BELL Core or in Music) that are designated "GLOBAL STUDIES in ClassFinder. Music Majors will receive 9 hours of global studies in their music history course sequence. Music majors should plan to take at least one three-hour Human Experience course that is designated GLOBAL STUDIES.

Junior Cornerstone Requirement

- Must be taken during the Junior Year
- Is NOT an extra course. Rather it is one of the Human Experience courses (see front page of checksheet) that is offered with the designation "Junior Cornerstone" in ClassFinder.
- For music majors, the Junior Cornerstone should be in an area other than music
- All Junior Cornerstone courses are problem-based courses, and are, by definition experiential in nature. Thus the Junior Cornerstone course helps meet the Experiential Learning Requirement (see below)

Experiential Learning Requirement

Students must take two Experiential Learning courses before graduating. These courses must be in two different categories of Experience Learning. Categories are:

- 1) Undergraduate Research
- 2) Community Based Research
- 3) Internships, Clinicals and Practica
- 4) Recitals, Shows, Exhibits, Major Performances
- 5) Service Learning
- 6) Study Abroad

These are NOT extra courses. Rather, they are courses (in either the general education BELL Core or in Music) that are designated "EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING" in ClassFinder. [NOTE: The number of hours credit does not matter as long as the student has taken two courses which are designated EL.]

Music majors have no trouble meeting this requirement because:

- 30-minute recital (0 hours credit; required in all music majors) will be designated EL (Experiential Learning-Recitals, Shows, Exhibits, Major Performances)
- All Junior Cornerstone courses (3 hours credit; required in all majors) will carry an EL designation.

Humanities Requirement

As noted on the front of the folder, the Humanities requirement in the BELL Core may be met by any 3-hour course from the following areas:

III. ELECTIVES (9 hours)*

Only 6 hours of electives are required for non-keyboard principals since they take 3 extra hours of piano secondary

**Extra ensemble and principal hours do not count as electives.
If a student elects to take a 4-hour language for the 3-hour humanities requirement or a 4-hour course for the 3-hour non-music elective (see BELL Core), the required number of electives decreases accordingly.

This major requires 132 hours.

Composition Majors are encouraged to:

- Choose CSC 1020-Introduction to Computer Science to fulfill the BELL Core Quantitative Reasoning requirement (if student has appropriate background).
- Choose PHY 1100-Acoustical Physics to fulfill the BELL Core Science requirement.
