1. Indicate your primary reasons for participating in this conference.

Briefly describe the conference and your interest in attending the conference (2-3 paragraphs).

The Sport Marketing Association (SMA) is the premier association for my area of interest. One of the goals of SMA is to bring together theory and practice in the form of research sessions, panels and the pedagogy symposium. The pedagogy symposium, in particular, is my primary involvement. The symposium is a forum designed to facilitate discussions on strategies, teaching assignments, projects, and other teaching and learning tools of use and importance to sport marketing faculty.

Over the years, I have presented research at the conference and presented teaching activities during the symposium. I find the conference to be a wonderful resource of new and exciting teaching strategies and activities being used in my field. In addition to the symposium, there are a number of industry speakers and networking opportunities. It is a great chance to "get a pulse" of the most current happenings in our field and is something that I feel ultimately provides value to our students for the takeaways I am able to bring into the classroom.

I will be presenting a teaching activity, I have modified from the text "Teaching for Learning: 101 intentionally designed educational activities to put students on the path to success" by Major, Harris and Zakrajsek. The activity "Did I miss anything important" is a recall activity designed for the beginning of the class session to write a memo to a student (real of fictional) who missed the previous class. That activity, along with a number of parallel off shoots of that activity will be discussed.

I believe the conference and the teaching symposium will enhance my teaching at Belmont in three specific ways:

- a. First, it provides me a chance to stay connected with the latest teaching strategies and topics in my field. Oftentimes, during the grind of a normal school year, it is easy to get into a "bubble" and fall back on activities that may be old and outdated. I am constantly inspired and surprised and the innovative things I learn when attending this conference. It reenergizes me and refocuses my efforts on finding new and engaging ways to connect with my students. Likely most of the material covered at the conference will be geared towards sport marketing courses however, there are a number of activities and information that I will be able to transfer to other courses I teach. For example, the presentation I will give is a class activity that can be applied to any course.
- b. Second, in the informal pedagogy symposium, I engaged in debate and refinement of my teaching ideas. Having the ability to gather feedback from peers in my area is very helpful. The format of this conference allows for a back and forth discussion with a number of academics who's main concern is finding strategies to deliver content. Oftentimes, during these discussions, new ideas emerge on other activities or ways to tweak existing activities in my courses. These conversations both formal and informal at the conference have had a significant impact in my overall teaching, not just my sport marketing courses.
- c. Lastly, it is a wonderful chance to meet with the vendors at this conference. For example, a couple years ago, I met with a textbook publisher at SMA and was able to customize and author a textbook (along with 3 other Belmont facility) that we are currently using in our Introduction to Sport Administration class. This example, shows how this conference in the past has played a role in developing our courses significantly. Meeting with these vendors has been tremendously beneficial to our program as we have utilized a fair number of vendors met during this conference.
