Dr. Carmine Miranda

Born in Venezuela to Armenian and Italian immigrants, Carmine began his musical studies at the Latin-American Academy of Violoncello and the Simon Bolivar Conservatory of Music where he was a member of the National Youth Orchestra and the Orchestra of Beethoven. In the United States, he continued his musical education obtaining a Doctoral Degree in cello performance with honors and a chamber music cognate from the University of Cincinnati.

As an avid soloist, he has performed with several chamber ensembles and orchestras including Caracas Municipal Symphony, Karlovy Vary Symphony Orchestra, South Czech Philharmonic, and Moravian Philharmonic among many others.

He has participated in music competitions as a soloist and chamber player winning several recognitions and awards at a national and international level. Among them include: Coral Gables Music Club Award for "Best Instrumentalist", first prize at the Alhambra Music Competition and the University of Cincinnati Cello Competition; Gold Medal Winner at the Global Music Awards; two Hollywood Music in Media Awards nominations; and is a laureate of Fischhoff Concert Artist Guild and Hudson Valley Competitions.

In the fall of 2019, Dr. Miranda was awarded a Belmont University Fellowship in the School of Music where he teaches cello.

Marina Berberian

Born in the former Soviet Armenia, Marina Berberian arrived in the U.S. in 1991. She received her Bachelor of Music degree with honors from Romanos Melikyan Music College in Yerevan, Armenia and Master's degree from the Yerevan State Conservatory. Additionally, she earned a Master's degree in performance from Florida International University.

Marina has participated in numerous recitals in South Florida as a soloist and piano accompanist, and she makes a sizable contribution to Allegro Music Center, the most important independent music store in South Florida. She has held various teaching posts in local public and private schools, and currently runs an independent piano instruction studio. She is the organist/pianist at St. Mary Armenian Church in Cooper City and serves on the board of Miami Music Teachers Foundation.
